

## What to see and do in February 2023

## Hickling Nature reserve Winter Wildlife Walk to the Raptor Roost 6 February 2.30pm

Join our guide at the Hickling Visitor Centre for a ramble to our raptor roost watch point. We'll be looking out for some of Hickling's key species along the way, as well as spending time at the watch point counting the marsh harriers as they come into roost. Barn owl, crane and pink footed geese are just a few of the other species we should get to see.

Walking distance is approximately 1.5 miles over (sometimes muddy) uneven ground, so please wear sturdy footwear. It's very exposed to weather at the watch point, so warm clothing, binoculars and a torch are highly recommended.
