The Last Voyage of the Gloucester: Norfolk's Royal Shipwreck 1682 Exhibition at Norwich Castle until the end of September This major exhibition will explore the dramatic discovery of the Gloucester, a warship carrying the future King of England and Scotland that ran aground in heavy seas off the coast of Great Yarmouth in 1682. On display for the first time are some of the fascinating objects recovered from the wrecksite. Most striking is the bell – that confirmed the ship's identity — which will be on show alongside beautifully preserved personal effects that tell stories of the passengers and crew, and of life on board the ship. https://www.museums.norfolk.gov.uk/norwich-castle

A luxury river cruiser which runs regular trips from the beautiful village of Horning, along the River Bure through the village and out to Ranworth Broad and back, passing lovely old thatched houses, windmills and Norfolk reed beds. Throughout the trip there is an excellent commentary and continual pointing out of all the water birds around at the time. HIRSTS FARM SHOP AND CAFÉ Mill Farm, North Road, Ormesby St Margaret, NR29 3LE

Based alongside the cattle sheds of a working farm this small farm shop is packed with seasonal local and home-grown goodies and has a fantastic fish counter. They have recently extended their popular café which is open 7 days a week for light bites, lunches, cakes and farmers' fry-ups! They prepare food freshly in the kitchen every day. Using home-reared, homemade and locally sourced ingredients, Ian and I personally recommend the home-made cheesecake selection it's fantastic!
